Rescue board repairs

At present there are more than a half dozen rescue boards in need of repair. Fortunately we have quite a few boards so there are still enough for patrol purposes. The repairs will be done as soon as possible. However, please note that many repairs HAVE BEEN DONE already only for the same boards to present with new damage a week later. The main problem is abrasion and cracks in the tail end due to the boards being dragged along the sand. Please CARRY boards – don't drag them.

Club Championships
