Treasurer's Report

It is my pleasure to present the audited Financial Report for Port Macquarie Surf Lifesaving Club ("the Club") for the year ended 31 May 2025.

The Club achieved a surplus of \$33,742 this year. As at 31 May 2025, cash and term deposits totalled \$686,048, an increase of \$71,209. The Club remains in a strong financial position.

Key drivers of the Club revenue include:

- Membership revenue \$39,923 which reflects another year of strong retention rates.
 Membership fees rose marginally in an effort to maintain our services but keep costs as affordable as possible especially for our patrolling members.
- Bar sales have again shown an increase from the previous year of \$18,857. However, rising expenses have impacted the bar profit as cost of goods sold and cleaning associated with the bar increased significantly from the previous year.
- Grant income has decreased significantly as the final payment for the Bushfire Recovery Grant was \$30,783 in 2025 compared to \$98,147 in 2024.
- Bank interest reflects the improved market interest rates in the early part of the financial year and a refinancing of term deposits. The interest income increased from \$15,399 to \$23,234.

Sponsorship has declined but our Gold sponsors David Plews and Sovereign Hills have remained loyal to the Club's development of Nippers and patrols. Men and Women at Work and Seed Catering have also provided sponsorship to help the Club maintain the work with our youth and safety on the beach.

SLSNSW has also provided continued support financially to enable the organisation in its operation. Port Macquarie Hastings Council contributes \$10,000 annually to help maintain the building.

Similarly, donations from Regional Australia bank and payments for assisting with Ironman events in Port Macquarie have helped the Club to meet its obligation to members and the public. Water safety and Aid station work at the Ironman was again well supported by Club members who put in many hours assisting before the event and on the day.

Expenditure on plant and equipment has increased in 2024/25 as we purchased new Bennett boards for the Nippers and some replacement equipment in the gym, first aid and patrol areas. However, depreciation of older equipment has decreased our plant and equipment value.

Expenditure has increased in line with the improvement in associated revenues in most areas. Training expenses increased to provide greater support for member education. Third party training costs increased due to the Club committing to provide specific First Aid training for the Bronze course to increase the skills of our members. Also, this year saw a large increase in the number of new members completing their Bronze training and existing members upgrading awards. Thanks to Mel Cockshutt for her enthusiasm and work ethic and Sandy Menzies and others for their assistance in creating a vibrant training environment at the Club. More qualified members means more volunteer lifesavers helping to spread the workload for patrols.

The Club is committed to a prudent and responsible approach to its financial management to ensure that Club is well placed to operate successfully during this period and beyond. Finally, I would like to thank the members, sponsors, donors and supporters of our fund-raising efforts, without which our Club would not be able to provide important lifesaving services to our community and to develop our future surf lifesavers through the delivery of our nipper programme.

Next up came Ocean Proficiency for U9 – U14. Great conditions meant once again that we met our goal to have all Nippers registered, Pool & Ocean Proficient by the time of Branch Carnival 1. Using the Nipper App we were able to have all Nippers that were registered for Branch Carnival 1 signed off in Surf Guard and entered without any trouble.

The start of the season greeted us with some tricky surf and wind conditions that made the first 2 Branch Carnivals shortened due to these conditions. PMSLSC Nippers produced massive attendance numbers for the first 2 Branch

Carnivals, resulting in us scoring well on the Points Table, as well as lots of smiles and fun throughout competition.

The Nippers Committee Spent great time this year ensuring that the Nipper Calendar was out into the publics hands, it was visible and accessible for parents to help coordinate their year of planning. The feedback from parents was that this was a great help and made life easier while trying to juggle other commitments.

Our Annual Board Camp was held early November at Hat Head. A massive turnout ensured that kids, parents and carers were able to enjoy stunning conditions. Our U14s got to soak in their last board camp as a nipper, they ran a very entertaining Skit Night that is high on every kids agenda. One special moment was our paddle out to remember a club legend in Brain Hamel. This epic occasion was captured via drone footage and will be forever remembered on a canvas picture handed over to his family last weekend as we remembered Brian with the introduction of the Brian Hamel Memorial Cup at Flynn's Beach.

PMSLSC held Branch 2 this season. Whilst the weather did not cooperate, there was still the feeling that the Club was more than capable of holding big events. A massive collaboration of volunteers and Nippers Committee members ensure that the beach was looking its best for the occasion. In all, over 50 people volunteered to help set up, feed, assist with officials, coordinate races and pack up the beach. Once again, the community spirit was shining bright. We have great confidence we can hold another Branch Carnival or a fast 5 type carnival next season.





Another highlight as the first half of the season was closing was our Xmas Party. The specialty training was showing great results with Nippers gaining in confidence and skills. This really was a huge success, and a massive thanks and gratitude from the Nippers Committee for allowing this process to go through and be funded by the Club.

As January was upon us, the start of the 2025 season was ramping up at aiming at providing as much coaching, experience and enthusiasm towards Country Champs and Branch 3 at SWR. Our Club had a small group of Nippers attend and put in a massive performance at Country Champs held at Warilla Beach on the South Coast. Some amazing individual results were achieved, with Gold medals and other medals won. PMSLSC showing again that we can compete on the big stage. Very much looking forward to a huge attendance showing up at 2026 titles held at SWR.

Branch Carnival 3 was held over 2 days at SWR. Fierce competition was held, with a battle between the 2 PMQ clubs to see who would be crowned Champions on the Nipper Table. On the Final day, a final push would see PMSLSC crowned Champions by a small margin. A massive shout out to our 2 JLOTY nominees Bianca Harrison and Max Pengelly who stood awaiting to see if they were successful in being named JLOTY winner for the MNC Branch. Unfortunately it was not Bianca's name who was called for female winner, despite a great showing. Max's name was called though for Male Winner. Meaning he will represent us at a state level.
