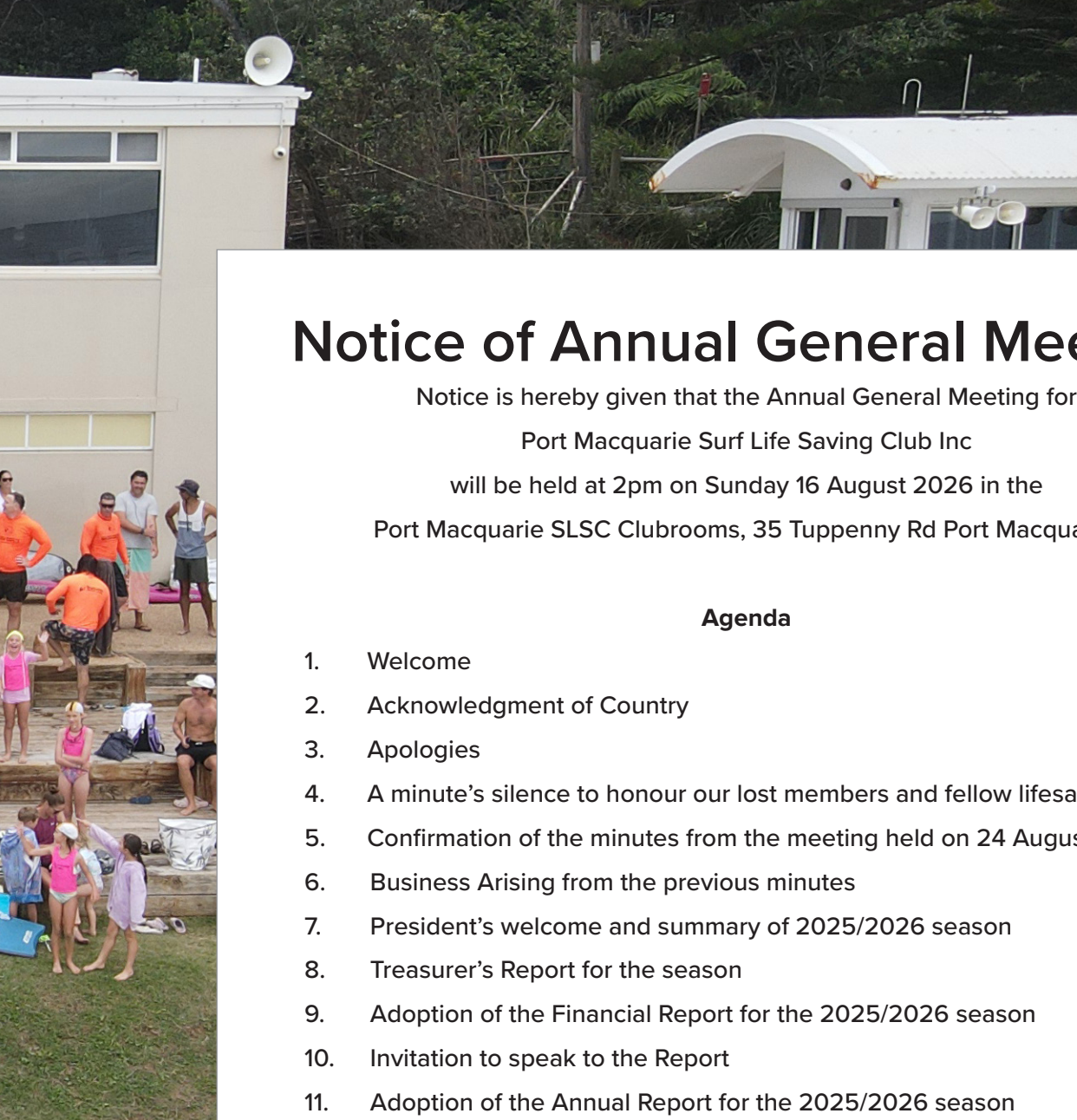


ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COUNTRY

Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club acknowledges with great sadness the passing of long-serving member Clark Valler, whose contribution to surf lifesaving spanned more than four decades.

Clark commenced his surf lifesaving journey with Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club, where he was a member for 10 years and achieved success as a NSW State Championship medallist. Following his move to Port Macquarie, he became an integral part of our Club, contributing across many facets of surf lifesaving.

A dedicated patrolling member, Clark served as a Patrol Captain and was a passionate competitor, earning NSW Country Championship medals in R & R, surf race and board events. He proudly represented the Club at MNC SLS Branch representative teams and also served as the MNC SLS Branch Coach. Professionally, Clark dedicated many years to keeping our beaches safe as a Beach Lifeguard for Hastings Council.

Beyond the beach, Clark also contributed to the administration of the Club, serving on the Executive Committee in the role of Secretary. His commitment extended to the next generation of lifesavers, guiding his three children through the Nipper program to Bronze Medallion and active patrol service, while mentoring countless other young members as an Age Manager. His passion for surf lifesaving became a lasting family legacy, with one of his children achieving a medal at the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships representing Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club, and another following in his footsteps as a Hastings Council Lifeguard.

Clark's decades of service, both on and off the beach, will be remembered with gratitude and respect. On behalf of all members, we extend our sincere condolences to Clark's family and friends. He will be greatly missed and fondly remembered.

Most importantly, we achieved what matters above all else—zero lives lost on our beach. Every rescue, preventive action, first-aid treatment, training session, and patrol undertaken by our volunteers contributed to that outcome. It is a testament to the professionalism, dedication, and commitment of our members, who continue to serve our community with pride.

At the time of writing last year's report, we could never have imagined the extraordinary heights our Club was about to reach. Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club was honoured to be named NSW Surf Life Saving Club of the Year 2025. While recognition was never our goal, it acknowledged the culture, innovation and volunteer commitment that continues to define our Club. Our success has never been built on awards alone—it has been built by investing in our people, empowering volunteers, and creating an environment where every member feels valued and able to contribute.

The NSW judging panel described our season as a "deeply considered journey", recognising our innovative Flexible Patrolling System as a major contributor to our success. They also acknowledged our outstanding membership growth, with a remarkable 55% increase in active members, the delivery of more than 276 training qualifications, and the engagement of more than 100 Youth and Cadet members. More importantly, they recognised a Club built on inclusion, community, and member-driven change.

Our achievements also attracted national recognition through the Australian Surf Life Saving Awards. Although we did not take home the national title, the feedback reinforced that Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club is setting a benchmark for innovation, inclusion, and volunteer engagement across Australia.

Everything we do begins and ends with saving lives. This season presented one of our biggest training challenges

with the introduction of the mandatory Lifesaving CPR qualification. Upskilling such a large number of members required an enormous commitment from our education team, trainers, assessors and volunteers. COMPETITION

Competition remains an important part of our Club's identity. Throughout the season, our competitors proudly represented Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club at Branch, Country, State and National Championships, achieving outstanding results across all age groups and disciplines. These achievements reflect countless hours of training and the dedication of our competitors, coaches, officials, age managers and families. Congratulations to everyone involved for representing our Club with pride.

STRENGTHENING COMMUNITY AND CULTURE

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

It is my pleasure to present the audited Financial Report for Port Macquarie Surf Lifesaving Club ("the Club") for the year ended 31 May 2026.

The Club achieved a surplus of \$39,405 this year. As at 31 May 2025, cash and term deposits totalled \$710,927, an increase of \$24,879. The Club remains in a strong financial position.

KEY DRIVERS OF THE CLUB REVENUE INCLUDE:

Membership revenue \$48,077 which increased by \$8,154 reflecting an increase in member numbers. Membership fees rose only marginally but with emphasis on training and recruitment our number of members has grown.

Bar and clothing sales (up 174%) have been important to our income with \$237,363 earned for the year. Both outlets have worked to reduce cost of goods sold and as a result Gross profit has risen by 46%. Great work by Bob as the Bar manager and Bec and Monique in clothing.

Grant income has decreased significantly again with grants received falling 43% down to \$31,036. The club is currently pursuing some significant new grants.

Bank interest for the club's term deposits has remained consistent with rates fluctuating with the market during the year.

Sponsorship has risen significantly during the year. Credit for this must go to Hayley McGrath who has worked tirelessly with our sponsors to keep them supporting the work of the club. Our Gold sponsors are Bradnams Windows, Sovereign Hills and Emma at Strive Finance. Bronze sponsors include Men and Women at work, Choices Flooring, Coast Cardiology and Restore. Danny at Pycon homes also continues to be a significant Club supporter.

An effort this year to increase our income with fundraising activities was successful. The Nipper BBQ on New Years Day was an enormous success. BBQ functions and raffles raised \$14,677 to add to the club income.

Surf Lifesaving NSW and the Office of Sport has provided continued support financially to enable the organisation in its operation.

Hastings council contributes \$10,000 annually to help maintain the building. However, due to the age and location of the building repairs and maintenance to the surf club building has increased 166% to \$24,084 this year. This is a considerable expense. The quality of the building may have affected the hall hire income which was down 26% this year.

As in previous years, donations from Regional Australia bank and payments for assisting with Ironman events in Port Macquarie have helped the club to meet its obligation to members and the public. Water safety and Aid station work at the Ironman was again well supported by club members who put in many hours assisting before the event and on the day.

Expenditure on plant and equipment was \$53,302. This included new patrol equipment, boards and skis, JASC gear and IRB equipment. With regular use in a marine environment depreciation of the club assets is high and replacement and repairs remain an important expense.

Training expenses again increased significantly. It rose by 77.45%. This may be large increase for the club but means more volunteer lifesavers helping to spread the workload for patrols. Also, many members have improved or maintained their qualifications which is critical to allow the club to patrol to the best of their ability. A big thank you to James Wotton for the many hours testing active members for the new Proficiency requirements.

The club is in a strong financial position moving into the new financial year and I thank the Board of Directors for their support throughout the year.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 31 May 2026

The financial statements cover Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated as an individual entity. Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in New South Wales under the *Australian Charities and Not-for-Profit Commission Act 2012*, the *Charitable Fundraising Act 1991*, and the *Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009* and *Associations Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2010* ('the Acts').

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis. The functional and presentation currency of Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the Association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements*, AASB 107 *Statement of Cash Flows*, AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors*, AASB 124 *Related Party Disclosures*, AASB 1048 *Interpretation and Application of Standards*, and AASB 1054 *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Revenue and other income

Sale of goods

Revenue is recognised on transfer of goods to the customer as this is deemed to be the point in time when risks and rewards are transferred and there is no longer any ownership or effective control over the goods.

Revenue from contracts with customers

The core principle of AASB 15 is that revenue is recognised on a basis that reflects the transfer of promised goods or services to customers at an amount that reflects the consideration the Association expects to receive in exchange for those goods or services. Revenue is recognised by applying a five-step model as follows:

1. Identify the contract with the customer
2. Identify the performance obligations
3. Determine the transaction price
4. Allocate the transaction price to the performance obligations
5. Recognise revenue as and when control of the performance obligations is transferred

Generally the timing of the payment for sale of goods and rendering of services corresponds closely to the timing of satisfaction of the performance obligations, however where there is a difference, it will result in the recognition of a receivable, contract asset or contract liability.

2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Revenue and other income

Revenue from contracts with customers

None of the revenue streams of the Association have any significant financing terms as there is less than 12 months between receipt of funds and satisfaction of performance obligations.

Other income

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Association is entitled to it.

(b) Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

(c) Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenue, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST), except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payable are stated inclusive of GST.

Cash flows in the statement of cash flows are included on a gross basis and the GST component of cash flows arising from investing and financing activities which is recoverable from, or payable to, the taxation authority is classified as operating cash flows.

(d) Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Items of property, plant and equipment acquired for nil or nominal consideration have been recorded at the acquisition date fair value.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the assets useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

Assets purchased with a cost of less than \$1,000 are fully written off as an expense in the year of purchase.

(e) Property, plant and equipment

(f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

(g) Adoption of new and revised accounting standards

The Association has adopted all standards which became effective for the first time at 31 May 2026, the adoption of these standards has not caused any material adjustments to the reported financial position, performance or cash flow of the Association.

3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgments

The directors make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key estimates - impairment of property, plant and equipment

The Association assesses impairment at the end of each reporting period by evaluating conditions specific to the Association that may be indicative of impairment triggers. Recoverable amounts of relevant assets are reassessed using value-in-use calculations which incorporate various key assumptions.

Key estimates - receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Report

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report of Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated (the Association), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 31 May 2026, the statement of profit or loss, the statement of changes in equity and the statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies, and the directors' declaration.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the *Basis for Qualified Opinion* section of our report, the accompanying financial report of the Association for the year ended 31 May 2026 is prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009 and Associations Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2010.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

We did not observe the counting of physical inventory stated at \$50,600 as at 31 May 2026. We were unable to satisfy ourselves as to the inventory quantities at that date by other audit procedures. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to this amount was necessary.

As is common for organisations of this type, the committee have implemented systems of controls to ensure monies received are properly recorded in the accounting records, but it is impractical to establish control over the collection of revenue for receipts of cash, donations and other fundraising activities until after their entry into financial records. Our audit procedures with respect to revenue from these sources had to be restricted to the amounts recorded on the bank statements and the financial records. As a result, we are unable to express an opinion as to whether revenue from cash, donations and fundraising activities is complete.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report* section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including Independence Standards)* (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

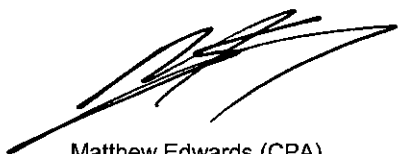

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING REPORT

As another season comes to a close, I would like to sincerely thank every member who contributed to lifesaving operations throughout the year. Whether you patrolled, provided water safety, trained members, assessed awards, operated an IRB or UAV, responded to incidents, mentored others, served as a Patrol Captain or supported lifesaving behind the scenes, your contribution helped make this another successful season for Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club.

KEEPING OUR COMMUNITY SAFE

The primary role of our lifesaving team is to provide a safe environment for beach users, and once again our members delivered an outstanding service to the Port Macquarie community at Flynn's Beach.

This season 245 members contributed to patrol operations across 146 patrol shifts (Half Day Shifts), providing over 6,282 volunteer patrol hours. During this time our patrol teams assisted in protecting more than 40,000 beachgoers, responded to 10 rescues, provided 35 First Aid treatments and undertook more than 1,077 preventative actions.

While rescues and First Aid incidents often attract the most attention, many of the most important lifesaving interventions occur before an incident develops. Patrol members spent countless hours advising swimmers, identifying developing risks, monitoring changing conditions and helping beachgoers make safer decisions. Their local knowledge of Flynn's Beach, changing tides, sand movements and surf conditions remains one of the Club's greatest strengths and contributes significantly to the safety of our community.

Of the rescues performed this season, the majority were completed using rescue tubes and rescue boards, highlighting the skill, judgement and responsiveness of our patrol members in often challenging surf conditions.

We certainly experienced some large surf throughout the season, however Flynn's Beach remained open for the vast majority of patrol days, with only two beach closures required.

Members also assisted with Search and Rescue operations across the Mid North Coast.

BUILDING CAPABILITY

One of the highlights of the season was the continued focus on developing capable, confident and skilled lifesavers.

The season commenced with a Search and Rescue Exercise and Patrol Captain and Leadership Day, setting the tone for a year focused on preparedness, leadership and continuous improvement.

Education and training remained a significant focus throughout the season, with members achieving awards and qualifications across Bronze Medallion, Surf Rescue Certificate, First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation Techniques, IRB Crew, IRB Driver, Patrol Captain, Trainer, Assessor, UAV Operations, Officials and a range of other lifesaving disciplines.

Every qualification achieved represents a member who has invested their time and effort. Thank you to every member who undertook training, renewed qualifications or challenged themselves to gain a new award this season.

STRENGTHENING PARTICIPATION

One of the most pleasing aspects of the season has been the continued growth in member participation.

This season 245 members contributed to patrol operations, compared with 206 members last season and just 85 members five years ago. Patrol hours also increased significantly, rising from 5,384 hours last season to more than 6,282 hours this season—an increase of almost 17%.

These figures tell an important story. They demonstrate that people want to join our surf life saving and patrol. They also suggest that initiatives such as Flexi Patrols are helping more members find a way to participate that works alongside family, work and other commitments.

Our goal is not for a small number of members to carry the responsibility of patrol operations. Rather, we want



to create opportunities for more members to gain skills, contribute to the Club and share the responsibility of keeping our beach safe. Every contribution matters. Whether a member completes many patrol hours or only a few, they are helping to build a stronger, more resilient Club and community.

At the same time, I would like to acknowledge those members who contributed exceptional numbers of patrol hours throughout the season. Their willingness to consistently step forward, support patrol operations and lead by example made a significant contribution to the success of our lifesaving service. On behalf of the Club, thank you for your commitment and generosity.

The Club also continued to foster a culture that welcomes participation in many forms. Members contributed through patrols, training, competition, leadership, emergency response, water safety and community engagement activities. This diversity of contribution is one of our greatest strengths.

We were proud to celebrate initiatives such as Red and Yellow Day and Ladies on Patrol, and honoured to be selected as the national launch club for Rainbow Beaches. The Club also hosted the second Brian Hamel Memorial Race and provided opportunities for our Youth Patrol members to broaden their experience through visits to Sydney's Northern Beaches.

Finally, I would like to thank our Patrol Captains, Vice Captains, Trainers, Assessors, Emergency Call Out Team members, Water Safety personnel and the broader



Lifesaving Leadership Team for their dedication and support throughout the season.

Most importantly, thank you to every member who pulled on the red and yellow this year. Your commitment, professionalism and willingness to serve others is what makes Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club such a special organisation.

It has been a privilege to work alongside so many dedicated members throughout the season and I am incredibly proud to lead such a capable, supportive and community-focused lifesaving team.

FLYING THE RED AND YELLOW: OUR CLUB JOINS THE NATIONAL CELEBRATION

This year, Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club proudly took part in Red & Yellow Day — a nationwide celebration recognising the thousands of Surf Life Saving volunteers who give their time to keep our beaches safe.

The red and yellow is one of the most recognisable symbols in the country. For our members, it's far more than a uniform. It represents the early mornings on patrol, the hours of training in the surf, the camaraderie of competing alongside teammates, and a shared commitment to service that runs through everything we do. From our youngest Nippers to our most experienced patrol captains, our members carry those values with pride — on the beach and beyond.

To mark the day, our members took that pride into their working lives. Whatever their day job — in the office, the classroom, the workshop, the hospital or anywhere in between — they wore their red and yellow to work. It was a simple but powerful gesture: a way to promote Surf Life Saving in every corner of our community and to showcase the contribution our volunteers make well beyond the beach. Colleagues asked questions, conversations started, and the story of what it means to patrol our shores reached people who might never have heard it otherwise.

That connection between everyday life and lifesaving was captured beautifully by Camden Haven High School, a community that encompasses staff, students and families involved in surf lifesaving clubs from across NSW. As they reflected on the day:

"For many in our school community, the red and yellow isn't just a uniform — it represents early mornings on patrol, training in the surf, competing alongside teammates, and a shared commitment to service and



community. From Nippers to patrol captains, our students and staff proudly carry these values both on the beach and in the classroom."

DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION REPORT

I am always a little sad to see the patrol flags come down, but the off-season leaves little time for quiet reflection—there is always work to be done and training to complete! The 2025/26 season has been incredibly intense, highlighting the phenomenal dedication of our members, trainers, and assessors.

A highlight of this season – When we were told we had to retrain our entire membership in Lifesaving CPR (LCPR), now a part of annual skills maintenance. It provided hours of endless entertainment as we muddled through the initial stages. However, we quickly transformed into a well-oiled machine, vastly improving the resuscitation skills of our lifesavers. Against the odds, we up-skilled more than 230 members, significantly boosting our operational capability.

A massive thank you goes out to everyone who took part and assisted with LCPR training. Who could forget that monster session organised by the legendary Mel C. during our Nipper board camp at Hat Head SLSC?!

Whilst LCPR consumed a vast amount of time, our training team still delivered top-tier education for the vital awards that keep us running as an emergency service. Fitting in Bronze Medallion, SRC transitions, and IRB courses and many others around our heavy LCPR schedule was no easy feat. Thanks to the flexibility of our trainers and assessors, we successfully achieved the following qualifications this season:

This mammoth effort by the training team was rightly recognised at our club awards ceremony, where they were gifted some very funky yellow YETI cups (many thanks!).

2025/26 also saw a first for the club, in that we ran the course colloquially known as 'the course with no name'. This course facilitated by state allowed us to run through realistic scenarios involving casualties and an incredible learning experience during the subsequent exercise debriefs. This course also provided instruction on valuable practical rescue skills such as patient pick-ups on the back of an RWC sled, and landing/patient pick-ups from rocks!

We also ran, and many thanks to Doug Hawkins for facilitating, a Silver Medallion Patrol Captain's course. This allowed existing PCs to up-skill from Beach Management and recruit an additional intake of brand-new Patrol Captains. This was a focus

area for the training team given the importance and responsibility of the position, it's awesome to see so many willing to step up, and I hope we can continue this season.

The coming season promises to be just as challenging. LCPR is now a permanent fixture of our annual skills maintenance, and we must continue to build capacity in high-demand areas, including UAV operators, Patrol Captains, IRB Crew/Drivers, and RWC operators.

I'm incredibly proud of what we've achieved this season, and I'd like to thank all those involved in training, supporting and assessing. It truly takes a collaborative effort of dedicated individuals across our clubs, branch and state to maintain a service critical to our community. Thank you.

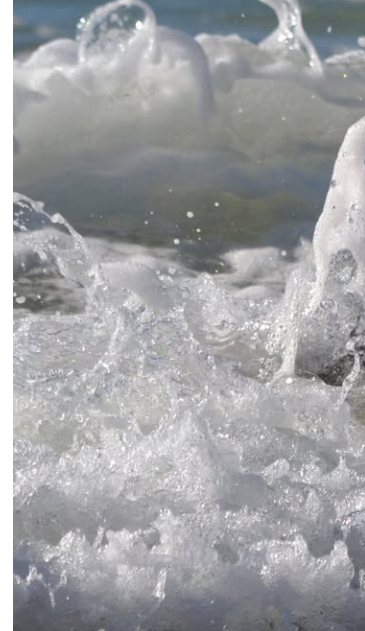
All in all the 2025/2026 season was another wonderful season where we continue to grow and build our club as a place for everyone to learn ocean skills and provide an opportunity to compete.

CADET REPORT

The 2025–2026 season saw the continued success of Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club's Cadet Program, which was introduced in 2024 to provide meaningful opportunities for young members to develop as lifesavers, competitors, and future leaders of our Club.

Built around five key pillars—Education, Competition, Club Involvement, Fitness and Training, and Social Activities—the program continues to provide structured pathways that encourage participation, personal growth, and long-term engagement within Surf Life Saving.

Throughout the season, the Club had 79 youth members aged between 14 and 29 years, comprising 15 Under 15 members, 31 Under 17 members, 7 Under 19 members and 26 members aged 19–29 years. These members played an important role across all aspects of Club life while continuing to build their knowledge, skills, and experience.

EDUCATION

Education remained a major focus of the program, with youth members completing an outstanding 81 Surf Life Saving awards throughout the season. These achievements included 20 Bronze Medallions, 11 Surf Rescue Certificates, 24 First Aid Awards, 14 IRB Crew Awards, four Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Awards, four Age Manager Assistant Awards, together with qualifications in IRB Driver, Rescue Watercraft, UAV Operations and the Silver Medallion Patrol Captain Award.

The strength of the Club's development pathway was further demonstrated by six youth members successfully transitioning into Council Lifeguard positions, while two additional members commenced employment as Pool Lifeguards.

COMPETITION

Our youth members proudly represented Port Macquarie SLSC throughout the season at Branch, State, and other surf sports competitions, demonstrating dedication,

commitment, and sportsmanship. Their achievements are detailed in the Surf Sports Report.

CLUB INVOLVEMENT

Beyond patrols and competition, youth members made significant contributions to the daily operation of the Club. They actively participated in patrols, gear and equipment management, Nipper Water Safety, Age Manager support, fundraising initiatives, social media, surf sports events and general volunteering.

These experiences not only strengthened Club operations but also provided valuable opportunities for members to develop leadership, teamwork, and a strong commitment to community service.

FITNESS, TRAINING AND LEADERSHIP

Regular fitness sessions, surf skills training and competition preparation ensured members continued to develop the physical capability and confidence required for both patrol duties and competitive surf lifesaving.

Leadership development also remained a priority, with a group of Under 15 and Under 17 members attending the Youth Leadership Camp on Sydney's Northern Beaches. The camp provided valuable leadership development, team-building experiences, and the opportunity to connect with youth members from Surf Life Saving Clubs across New South Wales.

The continued success of the Cadet Program highlights the strength of the Club's commitment to developing the next generation of lifesavers. Through education, mentoring and meaningful involvement across all areas of the Club, our young members are building the skills, confidence and experience that will see them become the future patrol captains, trainers, officials, competitors, and leaders of Port Macquarie Surf Life Saving Club.
